

# Moonlighter

This fish is related to the morwongs and shares a similar body shape. It is a fairly fast moving fish that mainly occurs around rocky reefs. It can be seen singly or in schools. It is recognised by a mostly silver body and pale pink-brown stripes along the top of the body. Its name refers to superficial similarities to fishes known as trumpeters.
