Red Morwongs have a red-brown upper body, a large area of silver on the face and belly, and a red-brown band across the snout and eyes. They occur in small to moderate schools around rocky reefs, more commonly in the eastern half of Victoria and into New South Wales. They are day active and mainly feed on invertebrates.
